

Update on the Community of Apantillo - Thanks to FBC Beverly!

First Baptist in Beverly has just concluded the second year of a four year commitment, to provide the funding for AMOS' ministry alongside the 1300 residents of Apantillo. Apantillo is a poor, isolated community in the mountains of Nicaragua, in the state of Matagalpa. First Baptist through the generous contributions of several key donors and from the church budget (missions and new initiative fund), provides up to \$9000 per year which provides basic health care for the 1300 villagers. How You Make Hope Happen in Apantillo, Nicaragua

FBC Beverly's support made the following possible in 2019:

Access to health care:

You helped 1,314 people have access to basic, but life-saving care in their own community. Thanks to you, Ada Luz was able to offer over 1,200 free clinic visits and do more than 1,000 home visits to follow up on the most vulnerable patients.

Access to medicines

Your generosity helped Ada Luz give out more than 3,000 prescriptions to treat diseases such as diarrhea, pneumonia, and fever, and to care for wounds and other health emergencies.

Sharing hope

Thanks to your support, there were no maternal or infant deaths (babies under 1 year old) in Apantillo in 2019. Because of you, our community health workers can save lives and have hope for the future!

Trained to Improve Health



Ada Luz shares about the challenges in community health work at our annual Health Promoter Training.

We are so grateful for another year of partnership between First Baptist Church in Beverly and AMOS Health and Hope.

FBC Beverly's generous support is helping families in the rural community of Apantillo, in the region of Matagalpa, have access to health care, medicines, and health education.

This year, Ada Luz Montenegro, Health Promoter of Apantillo, participated in an on-site training in Matagalpa as well as the annual training for Health Promoters at the AMOS campus.

In these one-week trainings, Ada Luz reviewed health protocols and learned important leadership skills! She continued learning about children's care - how to identify, prevent, and treat child malnutrition, and how to recognize the main signs of danger in children under two years old. She practiced taking vital signs, suturing, and using other wound care techniques, and she reviewed the importance of mothers and families properly using prenatal multivitamins, deworming, and family planning methods.

Luna Loops visits people in nursing homes and in homes, to bring a playful, compassionate presence. Luna brought props for us to wear! Thank You for a Very Generous Christmas Season at FBC
