

You can trust, however, that there WILL BE a chance, when we are all together again, to celebrate and to say goodbye and to say thank-you to John for his good work and ministry in our midst!

Worship Updates in Light of the Stay-At-Home Advisory and COVID-19

Right now, in the midst of the evolving COVID-19 crisis in our wider community, Kent and Julie are working each day to make sure that the church is also learning and evolving with the changing needs and new information that keeps coming out about the virus and our community and state response to its spread.

That means that, for a time, we will continue to see evolution in the ways in which we connect and worship, as well. As you know, we announced that through March 29th, worship would not take place physically or in person and would move to virtual worship, shown live on our Facebook page and then posted in a more polished form, thanks to Dick Stone, to our website and Facebook page later in the week.

At that time, we had hoped to be able to be physically back together for Palm Sunday and Holy Week. We now know that this will not be possible – so Julie and Kent are hard at work planning for Palm Sunday and Holy Week experiences and what those will look like in this wilderness time *as well as* suggested ways for you to participate and be part of it and observe these holy times at home. Those details will be forthcoming, but we do want to be sure that folks know that there will be **no physical gathering for worship on Sunday**, April 5th. We WILL continue to air a virtual worship experience at 10:00 a.m., although with some changes. We are planning too for a meaningful Easter Worship (in the likely event that we will not be able to gather). Watch the web site and next week's Bulletin for updates.

Because of the Stay-At-Home advisory, the church staff are no longer able to film all together in the sanctuary, so you can expect a reflection from the scheduled preacher for each day live at 10:00 a.m. There will also be prayer, scripture, and a small message for children from the preacher at that time. We are currently in the process of working on new and creative ways to then STILL release a video with a fuller worship experience, and that includes all clergy, as well as Esther Chang, early in the week.

We know that it can be very difficult to feel like things are so in flux right now. We want to cling to some certainty in the midst of changing times and events. We hope that what will and does remain for you as the certainty is that we remain the church, together. We remain a community of believers, dedicated to the love of God and one another. We remain a church family, strong in our conviction that love can travel across distance, and that we remain connected at heart, even when we are not able to be together in person. We remain strong in our faith that God is love, and whoever loves and shows love for others helps God to live in our midst. We can and will continue to do all these things. We can and will remain a family. We can and will worship God abundantly, together in these new ways, together in this wilderness place.

There may be a crack, right now, in the ways in which we *want* to do things; in the ways in which we are *longing* to do things...and yet, still, the light can find its way in. The light of God's love. The light of our community. The light of creativity. The light that will lead us forth, when the stone is rolled away, when we pour forth from our houses, and find our way back together. What a celebration that will be.

In the meantime, friends, we remain committed to you and to our community. Contact your pastoral team with any pastoral needs or questions via email or cell. We remain committed to new and creative ways of worship and of being together. We remain committed to our mutual love and care.

Lenten Season and Holy Week 2020

Lent is a six- week season of reflection. A time to reflect on attitudes and behaviors that separate us from God and to try on new and life giving ways of growing spiritually. Lent leads us to the promise of Easter.

Our Lenten Theme: "There is a crack in everything, that's how the light gets in." -Leonard Cohen, poet and musician.

Our Theme, Described: To be human is to be wounded, broken, or "cracked" in some way. Such moments can create space for the presence of God, the light of the Spirit, and the voice of Jesus to enter into our lives and to offer healing and hope, challenge and change.

As we walk together and live together in what is, surely, a time of a "literal Lent," a time with some wilderness moments and some moments of really separation and even loneliness, let us continue to strive, in all ways, to be the church, together. Check in on one another. Send love and prayer out into the world. Let your ministers know what your needs might be. We are walking through a wilderness time together, it is true. And yet, despite the cracks in everything, we know - we trust - that with God's love and with the gift and company of one another, even still, the light will get in.
