## Help Us Make Palm Sunday Worship Special!

First Baptist Family - we need YOU to help make our virtual Palm Sunday service this coming Sunday, April 5th, special!

In Jesus' time, the people cut the palms from the trees and waved them in celebration as he approached the city of Jerusalem. They waved them, and they shouted with joy, and they cried out, "Hosanna! Deliver us!"

They laid their palms and their coats in the road ahead of Jesus' approaching donkey, a sign of deep respect for the coming of a great leader.

We, in our day, tend to think of the palms as significant - and they ARE! - but, also, in those days, they were what was at hand...they were the trees that lined the streets and hills.

We may not be able to gather together with our palms this coming Sunday, but we CAN still remember and reenact exactly the significance and the celebration of the day, remember and reenact the joy people felt at seeing Jesus approaching. We can do this now, just as the people did then, by using what we have most available to us.

**So, here is where you come in!** We are asking for you to make (be as creative as you want! Draw! Cut shapes! Use ribbon!) or find something for your "palms" for this coming Sunday. You can craft them or find a beautiful flower or branch or leaf in your yard. Then **TAKE A PICTURE** of yourself/your family with your "palms" of celebration, and **send it to us** - please email to Julie at jflowers@fbcbeverly.org (or you can also text them to her or send via Facebook) **NO LATER THAN THURSDAY, April 2nd.** We will be using these in our Palm Sunday worship, so if you send a picture, make sure to give Julie the ok to share!

**AND have your personal palms ready with you on Sunday!** Watch from home and wave them with us!

All glory, laud, and honor - even if we cannot be together in person, we can be together in heart! We hope that many of you will choose to participate in this all-church expression of faith and hope and joy!

(As a reminder, you can watch our worship service LIVE via our Facebook page (First Baptist Church in Beverly) at 10 on Sundays - which is now JUST the scheduled preacher from her or his home, due to the stay-at-home advisory for our area, AND ALSO can then find a video with a fuller worship experience featuring all clergy as well as music from Esther Chang uploaded to our webpage, in the Bulletin, and on our Facebook page early in the week!)

### An Evolving World of Worship Experiences

As the situation with COVID-19 in our area continues to change and evolve, so, too, must our response as a church – not only in terms of how we strive to support one another and help meet needs in our local community, but, also, in terms of how we can offer and present worship experiences. We know that it can feel confusing and difficult to try to navigate these changing waters; it is a confusing time, in so many ways. Here is a handy reminder of the opportunities available, at this time, not only to watch and experience worship, but, also, to connect with other FBC family.

**Sunday Mornings:** Our Sunday morning worship experience has had to shift slightly, following the Governor's Stay-At-Home Advisory was issued and we were unable to continue to film all together in the sanctuary on Sunday mornings. Our current model now will provide for a LIVE 10:00 a.m. experience from the scheduled preacher for the day, filmed live from her or his home and shown via Facebook Live on the church's Facebook page (search First Baptist Church in Beverly to find that page). If you are on Facebook, we recommend "liking" or "following" that page to ensure our news updates and information appear in your newsfeed regularly – but don't forget to check the page often, too, as Facebook's algorithms do not always ensure that every post finds its way to every person!

We understand that Facebook Live is not easily viewed if you are not on Facebook; for that reason we ALSO all filming fuller worship experiences, which we be melded together WITH the live sermon from that day and posted to our church website (look at <u>www.fbcbeverly.org/sermons</u>), as well as our YouTube channel and Facebook page. This fuller worship videos will feature the sermon from the scheduled preacher, as well as music from our Music Director, Esther Chang, possible pieces from soloists and other musicians, and worship elements from the other clergyperson who did not preach. These fuller videos will be posted by Wednesday morning, and the link will also come to you in your email Bulletin. (Because they are an even fuller experience than the live sermon, even those who can watch live may choose to ALSO watch the fuller service, at your leisure!)

We apologize for the shifts and changes as the COVID-19 situation shifts and changes. This is a fluid situation and crisis, and we are finding that we as leaders must remain fluid and flexible, too. We recognize, too, that it requires some fluidity and flexibility on the part of you, our church family, too, and we appreciate that so much! We ALSO recognize that these elements represent learning curves – for us AND for some of you – and so this is a good reminder for us to be patient and gentle with ourselves and others as we learn.

One note: the reason the live service is available through Facebook is because that is, at this time, the best live streaming platform for our purposes. Some churches hosting live Zoom experiences have recently seen their services attacked by those who have taken over the control of the screen or microphone in the platform to share hurtful or attacking words or images – this happened to a church in our own area this past Sunday, and, as you can imagine, it was greatly upsetting for all those trying to worship. We have determined that for a live experience, the Facebook platform offers protection from this type of attack, which we think is important. In an effort to supplement that experience, we are also creating these fuller services, so that everyone can access worship in some virtual manner. Until we can all be together again in person, we will continue to strive to use multiple modes of communication and expression to reach as many folks as we can, but we recognize that this is a wilderness period for us all. Thank you for being on the journey with us.

**Drop-In Coffee Breaks:** There are now TWO weekly drop-in Coffee Breaks for you to pop in and see friendly faces with your First Baptist family. These times are meant to be relaxed times of communication and connection, in a time when we can too easily feel disconnected. The login details for these are listed in this Bulletin in a separate article, but there is an evening drop-in time with Kent Harrop on Wednesday at 7p.m.and a morning drop-in gathering with Julie Flowers on Thursday at 10 a.m. You can drop in at one – or both! We hope to see you!

**Live Kids' Times on Tuesdays:** Every Tuesday at 1:00 p.m., there is a Facebook Live Kids' Time being offered by Julie Flowers. This is for all FBC kids and kids-at-heart!

**Live Contemplative Fridays:** Every Friday at 1:00 p.m., there is a Facebook Live session around a contemplative practice, offered by Kent Harrop. Special guests at times also will offer live Fridays about music/how music speaks to our hearts and souls.

**Maundy Thursday:** We WILL have a Maundy Thursday service at 7:00 p.m. on Thursday, April 9th, and that will be set up as a Zoom gathering. If you would like to attend this service – which is open to all – please bring something for the bread and something for the cup, as we will share in communion together during this time.
