



Worship With Us!


Join us for our Worship Service this Communion Sunday, October 12th, 2025 at 10:00 a.m., either in person or via our *FBC YouTube Channel*.

Sunday, October 12th: Service Project – Making Blankets for Project Linus 6:00 p.m. – 9:00 p.m. in the Youth Lounge at First Baptist

Please note that because of a challenge getting the needed materials for the service project, the plans for last Sunday and this coming Sunday were swapped – meaning that last week the group watched a movie (*Coco*!), and this Sunday the group will try, try again with the service project originally planned for last week! The Sr. High Fellowship group will be getting into hands-on service project mode this Sunday, working on creating handmade blankets to be donated to Project Linus. Project Linus is an organization that works to collect and then to distribute these blankets to children who have experienced trauma in their lives, offering them comfort the way that Linus from *Peanuts* (for whom the organization is named) takes comfort in his own trusty blue blanket. In the past, blankets created by our youth have been donated to children in hospital units, including children staying at the Shriner's Hospital for Children due to severe burn injuries. This week's program is an invitation for the high school fellowshippers to give of their time and energy and efforts to help others, all while also having fun working together as group. Youth are invited to bring a friend along for the fun! Dinner will be provided, and the evening will end with the traditional sharing of Concerns and Celebrations, as well.

FBC's Wit & Wisdom: Let The Games Begin!




We are always looking for ideas for subsequent meetings, so if you have one, *let Elly know*.

We're Lending A Hand To Our Friends At Second Congregational Church. See How You Can Help & RSVP to Daniel if you are in!

Nearly two years ago now, our friends at Second Congregational Church, UCC, made the agonizing decision to close their church after over three centuries of impactful ministry from their location on Conant St. in North Beverly. Since then, they have been working diligently to discern how to do so in a way that honors the legacy of the church and provides a lasting benefit to the local community, taking great care along the way to ensure that they are proceeding in compliance with state laws governing the dissolution of an established church.

That process has advanced to the point where they are ready to clean out their building. To that end, they are planning a big work day on the afternoon of Sunday 10/26, and they are asking for volunteers from a few partner churches in the area to join them for it. In the words of their Legacy Pastor, Rev. Adam Isbitsky, "We're hoping a handful of good schleppers and/or cleaners might be available to help. We need to empty our attic and move a lot of other items around. Much is going to a dumpster; other things that will be sold or donated

are going to a staging area in another part of the building. Basically, we need people who can take direction and aren't afraid to put things in trash bags and throw them away if that's what's decided. Could FBC help out?"
