



## Maundy Thursday Service of Worship - Join Us on Zoom as We Journey Through Holy Week Together

As we move from Palm Sunday on March 28 <sup>th</sup> toward Easter Sunday on April 4<sup>th</sup>, we do so mindful that the journey from Hosannas to Hallelujahs is not without pain and loss and heartbreak along the way. Holy Week carries us from the jubilation and the triumphant entry into Jerusalem that we will celebration this coming Sunday toward the Last Supper with Jesus and his disciples on Maundy Thursday; then into the betrayal in the Garden of Gethsemane; and into the pain and anguish of the Crucifixion on Good Friday; toward the silence of the tomb on Holy Saturday; and, finally, to the joy of the Resurrection on Easter morning.

You are invited to join us in marking this movement, the shift that happens in the journey from Sunday to Sunday, with a moving Maundy Thursday service on **Thursday, April 1<sup>St</sup>, at 7 p.m.** This service will take place together, in real time, on zoom (the link to join is below), and all are welcome. We will have the opportunity to participate together in a ritual of handwashing during the service, as well as in the

sharing of Communion; those attending are invited to have a bowl of warm water, a towel, something for the bread, and something for cup all ready in their worship space as we gather.

The Maundy Thursday service is a brief but very moving service of Tenebrae, which comes from the Latin for "shadows." It moves from light toward darkness, as together we hear words of the Passion Story, from the end of Jesus' earthly life, and as we consider the shift from the light of Palm Sunday and the tenderness of the Last Supper shared together and the movement toward the darkness of the shadow of the cross.




### New Book Study Forming for April! Sign up with Julie ASAP!

Calling all life-long learners!

Julie Flowers will be offering a new study group, beginning after Easter on Thursday, April  $8^{th}$ , at 7 p.m. and running for 6 weeks (on Thursday evenings) taking a look at Karen King's The Gospel of Mary of Magdala: Jesus and the First Woman Apostle together in class and conversation. As we will be moving in the season of Eastertide particularly when we consider the vitally important role that Mary Magdalene and other women at the tomb play in the Resurrection story – it seems like a perfect time to consider not only the role of Mary as a disciple but, also, to read, think about, and engage with this noncanonical (meaning not in the Bible as we know it) text that was known and used by some early Christian communities. What might The Gospel of Mary of Magdala have to say to us now? Why is it *not* part of our contemporary cannon? What does it tell us about the role of women in the Jesus' movement? We will consider all these questions - and more! - together during this time.
